13 Initiatives

There are several recent key initiatives which contribute to a growing awareness of the role of creativity in both curriculum-based and out-of-hours learning. The following developments are designed to encourage partnership activities and programming between schools, community groups and artists and arts organisations.

13.1 The Artsmark award

The Artsmark scheme is an annual national arts award for schools in England, co-ordinated by Arts Council England. It is awarded as a benchmark of excellence for schools. The main aim of Artsmark is to encourage schools to raise both standards of arts education provision and the profile of arts education in the country. The criteria also include the provision of opportunities to share work with the wider community and for out-of-hours learning activities. Artsmark is available to all schools to bid for and lasts for three years.

Any schools wishing to register their interest in the scheme should send details of a named contact with the full name, address, telephone number and email address of their school to artsmark@artscouncil.org.uk (please indicate whether your school is primary, middle, secondary or special).

Selected local authorities were invited to bid for funding for improvements to primary school arts and sports facilities for school and community use. This is an innovative collaboration between Government (Department of Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS) and the Department for Education and Skills (DfES)), and three National Lottery distributors (Sport England, New Opportunities Fund and Arts Council England). The funding earmarked for the scheme is £130m. £75m of this is from the Government's Capital Modernisation Fund and £55m from the National Lottery. 250-300 projects nationally will be supported to develop schools' capital infrastructure. The scheme is intended to improve educational facilities in those areas that suffer from multiple deprivation. In London the boroughs of Barking and Dagenham, Brent, Greenwich, Hackney, Islington, Lambeth, Lewisham, Newham, Southwark and Tower Hamlets were invited to bid and to identify schools and projects that they wish to put forward. Sport England is administrating the scheme. General questions about the scheme should be directed to DCMS. 13.3 Creative Partnerships

The DCMS is allocating a total of £40m to Arts Council England to establish Creative Partnerships in 16 deprived areas in England by March 2004. This initiative is part of a national strategy that seeks to support school children living in socioeconomically, culturally and educationally deprived areas in the UK.

A Creative Partnership might include schools, youth groups, established arts education agencies, networks of cultural organisations and creative individuals. It is expected that 15 to 25 schools will be involved in each partnership.

There are currently three Creative Partnership zones in London, London East, London South and London North.

13.4 Specialist arts colleges

The Specialist Schools Programme helps schools, in partnership with private-sector sponsors and supported by additional Government funding, to establish distinctive identities through their chosen specialisms. It also helps them to achieve their targets and to raise standards. Specialist schools have a special focus on their chosen subject area but must meet the National Curriculum requirements and deliver a broad and balanced education to all pupils.

Any maintained secondary school in England can apply to be designated as a specialist school in one of ten specialist areas: arts, business and enterprise, engineering, humanities, language, mathematics and computing, music, science, sports and technology. Schools can also combine any two specialisms.

13.5 IMPACT

A new national three-year programme replaces schemes such as Splash, Splash Extra and Community Cohesion activities. It is currently (in August 2003) referred to as Positive Activities for Young People (PAYP) or IMPACT.

The principal aims of the programme are:

- To divert young people most at risk from social exclusion, crime and anti-social behaviour
- To support young people back into education and training
- To provide access to high-quality and sustained cultural, artistic and sporting activity
- To support young people in the transition from primary to secondary school
- To encourage long-term participation in community life through volunteering
- To promote community cohesion – bringing different communities together
- To encourage personal development in young people

Government funding is allocated to Connexions Partnerships. It will then be allocated to LEA-based youth projects to run in all school holidays for the next three years.

None of the funding will be available through Arts Council England. Arts Council England will provide support to organisations, act as an advocate for the use of the arts in the programme and broker arrangements between agencies. Arts Council England, London will provide advice and information to arts organisations and youth organisations. We will also be working with Connexions to influence good practice at every level.

13.6 DfES London challenge

London's rich cultural diversity and huge economic success bring many rewards to its growing population. But these same factors can also often mean that delivering successful secondary education presents a range of challenges to the whole community. The London Challenge is addressing these problems to improve secondary education in London. It focuses on:

- Transforming secondary education in designated London boroughs (Hackney, Haringey, Islington, Lambeth and Southwark)
- Creating bespoke individual solutions for the London schools that face the biggest challenges
- Providing a better deal for London, involving targeted work with heads and middle leaders, teachers and schools
