

APPLICATION FOR EXPORT LICENCE (OBJECTS OF CULTURAL INTEREST)

A licence is required for the export, both temporary and permanent, from the United Kingdom of any cultural goods which cannot be exported under the Open General Export Licence (Objects of Cultural Interest) 2021¹ or an Open Individual Export Licence.

Applications <u>must</u> be accompanied by a colour photograph of sufficient size and clarity to show details of workmanship.

Provenance

For all goods, please provide all known provenance and published references with the full description in the section headed "Goods to be Exported". Failure to provide provenance will cause delay.

NOTE 1

General

Shipment of the goods should not be arranged until a licence has been granted.

NOTE 3

For all goods the description on page 3 should state the style or class to which the object belongs, e.g. by Raphael, style of Adam, Chelsea, cloisonné, mezzotint, Sheffield plate; the nature of the material, design and decoration, general colour, period, country of origin and exact measurements. For a painting the full title by which it is usually known should be given: whether signed and, if dated, the date.

For gold and silver articles, the maker, date and place including hallmark should be stated and, except in the case of filled articles, the weight.

For photographic positives or negatives, state the name of the photographer and particulars of the subject e.g. the name(s) of the sitter(s), location, etc.

Value

This is the value of the goods as required to be declared for customs purposes.

Goods sent by post

This licence is available for one posting only and must be surrendered at the time of posting. Attach both sheets of the licence in an envelope marked "Export Licence" to the outside of the package or, if a batch, to one packet. Failure to do so may lead to delay.

Merchandise in baggage

This licence (both sheets) must travel with the goods and should be provided to customs authorities when requested.

Goods not sent by post
